**First Place by Pam Aoki**, 'The Gifts of the Seven Grandfathers' Size 15 1/8" x 18 3/4".

It is based on one of the most common Anishinaabe/Midewiwin teaching.

The Marquetry pieces are based on images produced by the artist Luke Swinson who is a member of the Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation.

The turtle (Truth) is in the middle of an Ojibwe Medicine wheel which represents: Mind (white, North), Emotion (red, South), Spirit (yellow, East), Body (black, West)
